State Annual Scholarship (In-state only): \$1,500, Two (2) Available

Northeast Chapter Annual Scholarship (School of your choice): \$1,000, One (1) Available

Eastern Chapter Annual Scholarship (In-state only): \$1,000, Two (2) Available

Applying for a Chapter Scholarship automatically applies the student for the State Scholarship also. The student must submit their application to the correct chapter scholarship chair where they reside. The key requirements are:

- Applicants must plan to attend an engineering program that is accredited by the Engineering Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET-EAC)
- o US Citizen at time of application
- Minimum GPA/SAT/ACT scores listed in application
- o List references, activities, financial information and jobs
- o Provide an essay
